

## School Bus Safety Rules

Riding the school bus is a privilege requiring a certain level of safety and decorum. A rider's privileges may be revoked if they cannot ride safely. The following provides basic safety rules for riders and their families. Families should visit <u>triboard.ca/about/policy</u> for complete policy and procedure information.

### RULES FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- parents/guardians are responsible for their children's safety going to, coming from, and waiting at the bus stop.
- parents/guardians are not permitted on the school bus unless it is to secure or detach a student from their assigned safety equipment.
- Harassment, threats, or physical violence toward the driver/monitor will not be tolerated and may result in the student's temporary or permanent loss of transportation provisions.
- Due to the strict timing of the bus schedule, the driver does not have time for discussion at the stop. Questions/Concerns should be directed to the bus company or Tri-Board.

#### TRAVELLING TO/FROM AND WAITING AT THE BUS STOP

- Be at the stop 5-10 minutes before the bus arrives. Follow bus delays on triboard.ca
- Never run to or from the bus
- Wait at your designated stop in a safe place, back from the side of the road
- Do not play in ditches or on snowbanks
- Avoid the Danger Zone, which is a 10 ft bubble around the entire bus

### BOARDING AND DE-BOARDING THE BUS

- Always wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and has activated its stop arm and flashing lights. If you need to cross the street, wait away from the curb for your driver to signal you across.
  - Stay 10 giant steps from the bus
  - If you do not have to cross the road when leaving the stop, wait until the bus has left the stop.
    Do not run alongside the bus
- Enter/exit the bus in a single file while holding the handrail. Do not shove others
- Remain in the seat until the bus comes to a complete stop
- Get on/off the bus only at your designated stop
- If everyone is getting off the bus, the people at the front leave first
- If you drop something near the bus, do not pick it up. Tell an adult

#### RIDING THE BUS

- Your school's code of conduct should always be obeyed on the bus
- Take your seat promptly and sit facing forward at all times.
- Place bags and backpacks on your lap. Keep the aisle clear at all times.
- Windows should only be opened with the permission of the driver. Always keep your head,
- hands and arms inside the bus. Throwing objects inside or outside of the bus is not
- permitted.
- Talk quietly; the driver needs to concentrate to safely drive the bus. Be extremely quiet when
- at railroad crossings so the driver can hear if a train is coming.
- Eating and drinking (this includes chewing gum) are not allowed on school buses at any
- time. Smoking/Vaping is not permitted on or near the bus
- Always follow the bus driver/monitor's instructions and be respectful

# **SCHOOL BUS RULES**

The school bus is an extension of the classroom.

# 1. ALL SCHOOL RULES APPLY

- 2.Obey the bus driver's and/or monitor's instructions at all times
- 3. Do not eat or drink on the bus
- 4. Be courteous and respectful to all
- 5. Remain seated while the bus is moving

Riding the school bus is a privilege, not a right. Misconduct may result in the loss of this privilege.

### **Reminders for Students and Families**

# **1. ALL SCHOOL BUS RULES APPLY**

- 2. Once on board the bus, students are only allowed off the bus:
  - at their school or transfer site
  - at their designated stop
  - If a parent approaches the driver and asks that their child be allowed to travel with them. NOTE: the student will not be allowed back on the bus
- 3. Students are not allowed off the bus to use the washroom, eat, drink, or for any other reason.
