

Student Coloured Tag Program

Statement

The Student Identification Tag Program is a quick and effective means for all stakeholders to ensure the safety of vulnerable students: purple tags for students who must be met at the stop; red tags for students with major medical concerns; The rubber tag is meant to be attached to the student's backpack, so it is easily identified by the bus driver. This program is focused on early elementary-aged students but can be used in any grade.

Procedure

Tri-Board provides tags to the school upon request. Schools should distribute tags only to the students assigned.

Met at Stop (Purple)

Students with a purple tag on their backpack will not be let off the bus by the driver without a parent/guardian present. Students will be taken back to the school if no parent/guardian can be reached before the end of the run.

Medical (Red)

All students with an identified medical concern are provided with a red tag to notify the driver that there should be a Plan of Care on the bus. This form is available at the school.
